

Dear Church Family,

Below is important information about our Christmas Eve worship services, and a special worship opportunity which you need to know about so you will be prepared for our celebration of Christ's Nativity. At 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, December 19th we will hold a Blue Christmas Prayer Service. This worship time will offer us a quiet space to acknowledge that we often come to this season with sadnesses and regrets, as well as joy and hope. You are invited to bring a photo (or photos) of loved ones you are missing or some other object that represents for you something that makes you blue at this time of the year.

On Christmas Eve, we will have two worship services. **The Family Service takes place at 4:00 p.m.** and will be led by our children. The traditional **Candlelight Communion Service will be at 7:00 p.m.** Please note that at both services, in an attempt to provide space for as many worshippers as possible, there will be a small area for compassionately-spaced seating. This seating will be located at the front of the sanctuary on the lectern side and at the front of the balcony. The rest of the sanctuary will allow for regular seating. All worshippers are asked to wear a face covering while in the building. Childcare will not be provided during either Christmas Eve service.

Be assured that our livestream ministry will provide both Christmas Eve services to you virtually and the Candlelight Communion Service will be shown again at 11:00 p.m. For those of you who will not be attending the 7:00 p.m. service, you will have an opportunity to come by the church to pick up a candle to use at home; you may pick up a candle on Sunday, December 19th from 10:30 a.m. till 11:30 a.m.

I hope that you will be with us to celebrate the Birth of our Lord Jesus Christ, whether that's in our sanctuary or from your home. Know that the Session and staff joins me in continuing to do all that we can to make worship meaningful, inspirational and safe. So, in that spirit, I invite you once more:

Come, let us adore Him, Christ the Lord!

Trinity's Annual Stewardship Campaign continues. The theme of this year's campaign is "Connected Now and Tomorrow". This theme highlights how we have adapted Trinity's worship, programs and group activities to remain a vibrant Church during the pandemic. However, while our new ways of connecting and serving God have progressed, they have also resulted in additional costs that will require your financial support. This is a friendly reminder that our Stewardship Campaign continues and your pledge is critical to maintain Trinity's programs, mission and staff. At this point in the Campaign, we have achieved only 71% of our financial goal and have received 129 pledges against our goal of 225.

All Church members should have received their stewardship letter and 2022 pledge card in the mail. You can also submit your pledge through your EasyTithe

account. If you have submitted your pledge, thank you!






