

Trinity's Annual Stewardship Campaign-Connected Now and Tomorrow

Trinity's Annual Stewardship Campaign continues. The Theme of this year's campaign is "Connected Now and Tomorrow".

This theme highlights how we have adapted Trinity's worship, programs and group activities to remain a vibrant Church during the pandemic. However, while our new ways of connecting and serving God have progressed, they have also resulted in additional costs that will require your financial support. This is a friendly reminder that our stewardship Campaign continues and your pledge is critical to maintain Trinity's programs, mission and staff. At this point in the Campaign, we have achieved only 74% of our financial goal and have received 140 pledges against our goal of 225.






- 1. A verse or verses of scripture that comforts, challenges and/or teaches you.
