
Rev. Pat Weikart will facilitate this group using **Patrick Saint** -Jean's text, "The Spiritual Work of Racial Justice" as a guide.



Syria-Turkey Earthquake



Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) urges your support in the aftermath of the 7.8- magnitude earthquake and its aftershocks in Syria and Turkey. 
At Trinity we:
