#### News and Notes from Rev. Faulkner

#### **Help Holy Land Christians!**

The situation for all in the Holy Land is terrible and, for many, only worsening. Stephanie Saldaña has reached out to Dr. Faulkner, asking if our church family might help her church family. Many of you met Stephanie when she led our spiritual renewal weekend in October, 2022 and saw her again when she visited last October. Stephanie's husband, Fr. Younan Masson, is a priest in the Syriac Catholic Church and is serving Saint Joseph's church in Bethlehem.

The Syriac Catholic Church is one of the smallest Christian communities in the Holy Land and this can mean life is a struggle, both as individuals and as congregations. In this devastating time, Stephenie has made an appeal for our assistance in helping her church family, as well as the staff of the congregation's pilgrimage hotel--a staff that it has become difficult to pay due to the complete lack of pilgrims.

The Session has approved a gift of \$500 and has also agreed to make Stephanie's request made known to our entire church family in order for us to make a one time gift. Donations can be made by writing a check to Trinity Presbyterian Church, with the memo notation: "Gift to Stephanie." Donations will be received until Thursday, February 29. No gift will be too small and no donation can be too large.

Our sisters and brothers, who worship only steps away from the birthplace of the Lord, need our help. May we hear their plea and respond as we are able.
