The Story of the Prophet Elijah

This story is about a prophet named Elijah. A prophet is like a mailman, they bring messages from God so we can know what he wants us to do. Elijah was a regular man who trusted God. Elijah did amazing things with God's help and God did amazing things for Elijah.

The land of Israel was in big trouble. The land had a bad King, named Ahab and his evil wife, Jezebel. King Ahab believed in a god named Baal (the weather god).

Elijah was told by God to deliver a message to King Ahab. Elijah went to Ahab and told him, "My God has told me that there will be no rain in the next three years until I tell it to." Then the Lord told Elijah to go and hide. God made sure Elijah had what he needed.

When the brook that Elijah was drinking from dried up, God told Elijah to go to a place called Zarephath, there he would find a widow who would give him food and water to drink. When Elijah got to the entrance of the town he asked a woman, "Would you please bring me water in a cup so I can drink and a small piece of bread?"

It's that time of year again! Time to collect health and beauty items for the Mother's Day gift basket project sponsored by the Lauren Rose Albert Foundation (LRAF). Mothers Matter assembles gift packages filled with women's health and beauty care products and then distributes them to women facing difficult challenges. Packages are delivered to women's shelters, children's pediatric hospital wards and centers, day care centers, and other facilities and agencies. 
Trinity News and Notes
