But God raised Jesus up, having freed him from death, because it was impossible for him to be held in its power.

**Acts of the Apostles 2:24*

"I don't know how people get through something like this without the Lord!" It is a phrase often said to me when a person is facing those moments in life that bring sadness or confusion or pain. The wonder is not that people get through with God's help, rather it is wonder that anyone can face the sufferings of this world without knowing the presence of the Lord.

I was recently reminded of a hymn that was commonly sung throughout my childhood and youth. Gloria and Bill Gaither wrote "Because He Lives" fifty years ago, The chorus of the song says: "Because He [Christ] lives, I can face tomorrow; because He lives, all fear is gone; because I know He holds the future, and life is worth the living, just because He lives."

A few months ago, Gloria Gaither was asked about the writing of the song and said, "I am still surprised that the song had such universal appeal It was so personal, I thought it might be just for us. It was the end of the '60s when it seemed the whole world was falling apart. In such a chaotic time, we were expecting our third baby. During this pregnancy Bill and I asked ourselves who would bring a baby into a world like this? It was easy to feel fearful for his future. But when Benjy was born and the nurse laid that little guy in our arms, it was an 'a-ha moment' of sorts. We came to realize that we don't get married, make a home, have babies and go about our lives because the world is stable. When has it ever been stable? We live our lives with confidence because the Resurrection is true. We held our son and said, 'We can do this. We can raise this child in this unstable world because of the power of life. Life wins! And because our Lord is alive, we can trust Him with our future.' Honestly, it was a song we wrote for us."

As we move to the joys of Easter, in yet another time of chaos and grave uncertainty, we will again celebrate the power of God's love; a love so great that even death cannot stop it. The resurrection of the incarnate Son of God does not end with Jesus being raised from the dead; instead, his resurrection is the beginning of the story of our resurrection. of our resurrection. We gather in Easter hope because of what has happened in Jesus of Nazareth, and because we are assured that God is not locked in the past of some deathly tomb, but lives with us here and now. Because the power of death could not possibly hold the Lord Jesus, we now experience his presence with us in our lives, in our time.

During this Easter season, I hope you will be a part of what is happening at Trinity and experience with us the strength that is found in the One who is our resurrection hope. God has raised Christ and in his Resurrection, we are being raised to new life right now! Because He lives, we have hope for today and reason to always be...


