

The Honorary Life Membership is represented by a silver membership pin that was presented to Louisa along with a personalized certificate. The Honorary Life Membership symbolizes values held dear by Presbyterian women. Here are just a few ways in which Louisa has shown her dedication to PW, Trinity, and to the community - She has been Rebecca Circle Moderator for many years, is currently on the PW Programs Committee, holds the office as Treasurer on the West Jersey Presbytery PW, and has served as a Deacon. She also is a founding member of the Mothers Matters Project and serves on its board, and has worked in the Cherry Hill School System for many years. Louisa is a kind and caring wife, mother, daughter and sister. A true Presbyterian Woman of faith and strength!

Have You Noticed Our New Chancel Banners?

New banners were hung in the chancel a few weeks ago and our members are delighted to see them! They've added beautiful color and interest to the plain chancel walls, and we were asked to tell everyone a little more about them. There are 8 banners in total, 4 on each side of the chancel, and each representing a different symbol of Christianity.



On the pulpit side of the chancel, the symbols are:

Communion—The bread represents the body of Christ being sacrificed for our sins, and the cup is the cup of salvation we receive through his blood shed for us.

Cross—The Cross is the principal symbol of the Christian religion, recalling the Crucifixion of Jesus Christ and the redeeming benefits of his Passion and death. The empty Cross reminds us of the empty Tomb and so also points to Christ's victory over death.

Baptism—The scallop shell has long symbolized the Sacrament of Baptism, since a shell is often used to pour water over the head of the person being baptized. It signifies the presence of the Holy Spirit at the baptism of Christ and, more significantly, the continuing action of the Holy Spirit in the baptism of believers. **Dove**—One of the most enduring symbols in Christianity, a descending dove symbolizes the Holy Spirit as related in the story of Jesus' baptism. It's also a general symbol for peace, purity, and new beginnings.



On the lectern side of the chancel, the symbols are:


Star of Bethlehem—Or Christmas Star, appears in the nativity story in the Gospel of Matthew, which guides the Magi to Jesus' Bethlehem birthplace, where they worship him and give him their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

Chi Rho—A Christian monogram and symbol formed from the first two letters, X and P, of the Greek word for Christ.

Crown—In addition to being a symbol for literal kingship and for God's favor, crowns also represent the eternal rewards for those who serve as God's ambassadors.

Alpha & Omega—the beginning and the end. Jesus himself proclaims that he is the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End.

We're very happy that the new banners are enhancing your worship experience, and we look forward to the day when everyone can see them in person!
