



TRINITY CHURCH SCHOOL

Church School has launched the new in-person rotation programs in November, and things are off to a great start! Things started on November 7 with "Mission Sunday". Elementary School children stayed together for the lesson and this month's activity, which involved making sandwiches for Cathedral Kitchen. The lesson was on Jesus's teaching about feeding the hungry. The children really felt good about helping those in need, and they did a great job of sandwich making. We made over 200 sandwiches for Cathedral Kitchen.

Sunday November 14 was the kick-off of the Family Worship, led by Rev. Sarah Craven in the Community Room. The worship was attended by 18 children and 12 adults. Rev. Sarah led a lesson about Abraham and Sarah, using props depicting Abraham and Sarah and the desert. The families had time for discussion about the Bible lesson, and then a hands-on activity.

MONTHLY ROTATION SCHEDULE

Below is a brief reminder of the monthly rotation cycle, along with a couple of special notes for December.

• 1st Sunday: Mission Sunday – Each Mission Sunday, **grade school-age children** will meet for a joint lesson and activity in Witherspoon. They will be taught a Bible story or lesson that will focus on service, followed by a mission-related activity. *Note: There will be no Church School for Elementary School aged children on December 5th, since the Children's Choir will be singing in the worship service.*



- 2nd Sunday: Family Church Sarah will lead families in worship in the Community Room in a relaxed, casual atmosphere that will allow families to grow their faith together. *Children of all ages are welcome!* Come to the Community Room by 9:30am; parents / guardians should plan on staying with your child(ren) for the service. *On December 12th*, *children and families will make an Advent craft. There will not be a separate Advent Festival this year*.
- 3rd Sunday: Church School All children will participate in a traditional church school lesson in their respective classrooms.
- 4th Sunday: Let's Worship Together **Grade school children** will attend worship in the sanctuary with their parents.

Important Notes:

- In months having a 5th Sunday, children will have a traditional Church School lesson on the 5th Sunday.
- Church School for **pre-K through Kindergarten** will largely remain as it has in the past. That age group will participate in the new rotation only on Family Church weeks.
- Except for the 4th Sunday, Elementary-age children will <u>report directly</u> to that week's activity (Witherspoon or Community Room).
- Our Nursery remains closed at this time, due to COVID safety precautions.

Mitten Tree

The Children's Ministries will again this year collect new hats, mittens, and scarfs for children that need some warmth during the long winter months. We will have trees set up in the Fellowship Hall and also Witherspoon

Connected Now and Tomorrow

Trinity's Annual Stewardship Campaign continues. The theme of this year's campaign is "Connected Now and Tomorrow". The pandemic temporarily restricted our opportunities for in-person worship together and significantly impacted many of Trinity's group activities and programs. It has required everyone to work, pray and think differently. We all missed the connection of being physically together as our Trinity Church family. Fortunately, our Church staff and many volunteers accepted the connectivity challenges presented by the pandemic and have been very creative in finding solutions. Our virtual worship services have been professionally presented, in-person worship has returned and has successfully adapted to the pandemic requirements, and many Church groups have reconnected. Many of our new ways of connecting will serve Trinity well into the future.



During the Stewardship Campaign in November, speakers addressed how we have transitioned to virtual worship, been creative with our youth education and kept Church programs viable during the pandemic. While all of these initiatives were necessary to achieve the mission of the Church, they also resulted in additional costs that will require your financial support.

Since our sanctuary has reopened for worship, our expenses have increased. Investments in technology have allowed our livestream services to continue. Our mission outreach has increased as we help others during these difficult times. With a new program year underway, we've resumed the in-church practice of passing the Membership Registers to record our attendance at church. But what if you're watching at home?


