Turned Around by Discipleship

From that time Jesus began to proclaim, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near."

Matthew 4:17

Ash Wednesday is just around the corner! Now that's a phrase you don't hear every day . . . at least not around Trinity. Perhaps you already know that you observing Lent has not always been the Presbyterian thing to do. The Lenten season, which is primarily associated with repentance for our sinful ways, was eschewed by the early Reformed Christians because repentance is not a seasonal occurrence, but a daily way of life--we are called to turn from sin and turn toward God each and every day of our lives. That is most clearly demonstrated for us in our baptisms.

One of the ancient vows of baptism is the commitment to turn from all that opposes God's holy will and seek to follow Christ in every aspect of life. Baptism is the sacrament by which we mark the beginning of the life of discipleship, which is, by definition a life of learning to love God by following Christ as we live in the power of the Holy Spirit. Spiritually, discipleship is indeed about repentance, which is to say, it is about turning around, again and again and again. Turning from all that opposes God in our lives so we might more closely follow the Lord Jesus.

Of course, the quotidian can be hard. One of the complaints of life during a pandemic is the monotony many of us face. Perhaps that is why the ancient church developed seasons to concentrate on various aspects of the daily Christian life. Maybe this Lent, you and I could spend some time focusing on what it means for us to leave sin behind by turning—again and again and again—to God and God's will for our lives. For me, that will mean trying to give a bit more time to daily prayer and to spending a few more minutes than usual reading the Bible. In these simple—and essential practices of discipleship—I hope to find the Holy Spirit drawing me closer. Who knows? Perhaps if we both do this, we might find turning to Christ becomes a more common part of our living . . . and thus find the nearness of God's reign on earth even in the dailiness of our lives. If that is what happens for us this Lent, we'd all have good reason to be

Session Update

At its stated meeting on January 4, 2021 the Session:

- Updated and approved the Member Count of 645.
- Heard Rev. Faulkner and Rev. Craven's Ministerial Reports.
- Learned that pledges for 2021 are lagging last year's numbers.
- Agreed to hold the Budget Forum on Sunday morning, January 31.
- Confirmed that the Annual Report will be available digitally soon after the Forum.
- Established that the Annual Meeting will be held on Zoom on February 14, 2021.
- Approved up to \$1,500 for new internet access equipment.
- Voted to limit committal service attendees to no more than 12 family members/friends and the officiating minister(s) and require that all social distancing protocols be followed without exception.
- Reviewed Trinity's Year-to-Date Financial Information as of Nov 30: Pledge income was \$553,049 (\$6,178 under budget) Expenses were \$681,561 (\$102,741 under budget)
- Shared prayer concerns and celebrations.




Fellowship Group—Next Meeting is Sunday, February 21 at 1:00 pm



MISSION THURSDAY A HUGE SUCCESS!

The pandemic created many challenges for our church and congregation. One of those was how to continue our mission and outreach activities during this unusual time. In early April, a suggestion was made to have a **Stay-at-home Mission Project – Cathedral Kitchen Sandwich Making**.

Our congregation provided over 500 sandwiches for the clients at Cathedral Kitchen. The project was so successful, the question was asked "Why not do it again?". After another highly successful effort a couple of weeks later the question became "Why not do this every other week?" and Mission Thursday was born. As time passed, Mission Thursday continued to grow. Collecting food for the Cherry Hill Food Pantry was added.

The Deacons recognized Mission Thursday as an opportunity to continue their mission activities during the pandemic and activities including Summer Sharing, School Supply Drive, Gift of Warmth Coat Drive and Christmas Sharing were included with great success. PW was able to utilize Mission Thursday to support the R&M Boarding home including their Christmas Stockings project.

Mission Thursday turned out to be a great success. The support from the congregation was simply amazing! In 2020, our congregation donated approximately 11,500 sandwiches, 3000 bottles of water, 150 bags of fruit and many boxes/bags of snacks to Cathedral Kitchen. In addition, we collected almost 5,000 pounds of food and miscellaneous household supplies for the Cherry Hill Food Pantry. The mission activities supported by the Deacons and PW were also huge successes.

Our thanks to everyone who participated in Mission Thursday last year. Thanks to your generosity, we were able to continue our mission and outreach activities and make a real difference in our community during these challenging times.

Mission Thursday is off to a great start again in 2021 with two events during January. The M&O Committee plans to continue it for the foreseeable future with some new wrinkles. We are planning on collecting used books for BookSmiles in March or April. If you have any ideas on how we can make Mission Thursday even better, please reach out to Eric Waraas or Hersch Craven.

Facebook– Our Facebook site will also keep you informed. This is also where you can post comments and share photos!


YouTube Videos— Check out our Virtual Worship videos but also videos of past musical performances and congregants sharing what makes Trinity such a great place to worship!
