Protecting the Struggle

Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

His voice was a bit shaky. "Greg, last Sunday, you said prayer was a struggle. When you said that, it hit me in my gut. I had to go home and think about it for quite a while. That's why I'm calling you."

In Stephanie Saldaña's book, *The Bread of Angels*, she tells of her friend Michael, who knew that "prayer matters; that prayer is something that needs to be protected." Over the last several years, prayer has been one of the topics that has most often come up in my conversations with you and I have been grateful to see that prayer "matters" to you. Saldaña last month pointed out the life-giving power that flows from daily interaction with the Living God. She helped us to see that this relationship, this conversation must be protected if it is to bear fruit in us. In short: we must keep saying *Let it be!* to the Spirit's presence in our lives.

As we begin the annual observance of giving thanks, expectancy and celebration that marks November and December, there is no better time to consider how your prayer life is going. Are there ways you'd like to see things deepen in your friendship with God? Is there some way that you might be able to better protect your prayer life? Is it simply time to admit the struggle and return to Christ in prayer?

The man who called with a trembling voice went on to say that he had never been able to say that prayer was a struggle, but that was often exactly how he felt and now that his pastor had "said it right there in front of the whole church," he felt empowered to talk about it. He said, in part, "I'm not sure what I can do or even how to go about it, but I guess I'm wanting to re-enter the struggle and see if God shows up." That sounds to me like someone who believes the conversation we call prayer is worth protecting—not because it's easy, but because the relationship with Christ matters. It matters because we were made for God and the only hope we have is in God's gracious love.

As we move from Thanksgiving to Advent to Christmas, I hope you and I will not give up on God or ourselves, but find in these holy days a renewed energy to protect our time (that is to say, our relationship) with the Lord Jesus and that we will pray. If we will do that, our congregation would be able to keep...



Facebook— Our Facebook site will also keep you informed. This is where you can post comments and share photos!


YouTube Videos— Check out our Virtual Worship videos but also videos of past musical performances and congregants sharing what makes Trinity such a great place to worship!
