Exercising Faith

What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill," and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead. But someone will say, "You have faith and I have works." Show me your faith apart from your works, and I by my works will show you my faith. James 2:14-18


During the last year, I have preached several sermons that have dealt with the nature of redemption. As Protestant Christians, we often speak of salvation being by grace alone through faith alone. In other words, you cannot do anything to win God's favor. The good news (the Gospel) is that we don't have to <u>earn</u> God's love; God already loves us! To experience that love is to experience the grace God offers us in Jesus Christ.

But the Apostle James is part of a church community that has gotten so secure in the grace of God that the people no longer believe they need to express their faith through action. For Christians like that, James has a hard word: faith without works is dead—it isn't doing anybody any good. Faith needs exercise.

Sometimes Presbyterians are thought of as the great doers. We are a hard-working people who have embodied the "Protestant work ethic" and Trinity is no different. I am deeply grateful for the many wonderful volunteers that make our education, music, and mission programs possible. All of them are people who are expressing their faith in Christ by working for the Kingdom.

As wonderful as each of our volunteers is, we need more if we are to continue to be a healthy and vibrant church that strengthens our members and attracts new members. This fall, the elders are leading an initiative to help every member find a place of service within the many ministries that Trinity offers. This is exciting because it means our expanding church family needs your help to be our best. There are committees that could use your input. There are mission projects that would benefit from a few of your hours every now and again. The church school and livestream teams are always looking for helpers. The Property and Building committee would be happy to have volunteers. The choirs are ever ready to welcome folks to help them make joyful music to the Lord. Your volunteering will be a joy for you and a blessing for all of us. It will be putting your faith into action .

Our love for God and our faith in Jesus Christ is expressed—exercised—by being put into action. As we gear up for another year full of hope and promise, I am asking you to pray about where your faith is leading you. Take a step of faith and ask God every day in your prayers, "Lord, how do you want me to serve at Trinity this year?" Let your works show your faith and watch as your exercising faith grows. If we will each so pray and serve, we'll have every reason to keep...

We are looking forward to kicking off our program year with the annual Pancake Breakfast, Sunday, September 10th! 1st Sunday of Every Month: Mission Sunday

Each Mission Sunday, grade school-age children will meet for a joint lesson and activity. They will be taught a Bible story or lesson that will focus on service. The lesson will be followed by a mission-related activity such as making cards for shut-ins or sandwiches for Cathedral Kitchen, or joining in a mission activity being run by the Mission Committee.

2nd Sunday of Every Month: Family Church

Pastor Sarah will lead families in worship in the Community Room in a relaxed, casual atmosphere that will allow families to grow their faith together. Parents and extended families are welcome! (Come to the Community Room by 9:30am and plan on staying with your child(ren) for the service). Children of all ages are welcome!

All children will participate in a traditional church school lesson in their respective classrooms.

4th Sunday: Let's Worship Together

Grade school children will attend worship in the sanctuary with their parents. This is an important step in their journey to becoming members of Trinity and will allow for interaction among the generations. In the future, these 4th Sunday worship services may sometimes include a brief children-oriented component, such as a "Children's Message" or children leading a reading, song or prayer.



Care 'n Share is reopening on Tuesday, September 12th. Our hours are 10am-1pm on Tuesdays, Thursdays & the first Saturday of the month.


Your donations of clean, useable clothing & house wares may be dropped off during those hours and also on Sundays following the 9:30 a.m. worship service.


