## **Children's Ministries**

This past month Children's Ministries focused on a theme of Spreading Love and Kindness. During Mission Sunday, children created 100 hygiene kits for those in need. They also created cards sharing messages of God's love for our homebound members. Discussions were had about how their work and acts of kindness will help others in our community.

During recent Family Church services, that message continued with a lesson about Dr. Martin Luther King's work in promoting acceptance and celebrating our differences. Children and families created a uniquely made banner, where designs were interchangeable to show all our differences. Children also made dream clouds focusing on their future goals and dreams.

In February we read the children's book-*Beautiful Oops* by Barney Saltzberg and made connections to Jesus and Bible stories. Students created paintings and folded them in half to create a new design. This taught us that we can learn from our mistakes and sometimes create something new and beautiful as a result.

Over the past 4 years we have collected approximately **43,000** sandwiches, 16500 bottles of water, 1500 bags of fruit and 700 bags/boxes of snacks for Cathedral Kitchen.

In addition, we have collected over 22,000 pounds of food and household supplies for the Cherry Hill Food Pantry. Thank you for your ongoing support. Together we are making a real difference in our community.

#### What is CROP Walk?

Community Responding to Overcome Poverty (CROP) Hunger Walks are sponsored by Church World Service (CWS), a faith-based organization transforming communities worldwide through just and sustainable responses to hunger, poverty, displacement, and disaster. 25% of what we raise goes to a local charity of our choice. The rest of the money goes to things like:

Chickens that provide a family with a constant supply of eggs (protein) to help children become stronger and healthier. Home Gardens that provide three families with better nutrition and extra income with diversified diets and plenty of nutritious vegetables.
